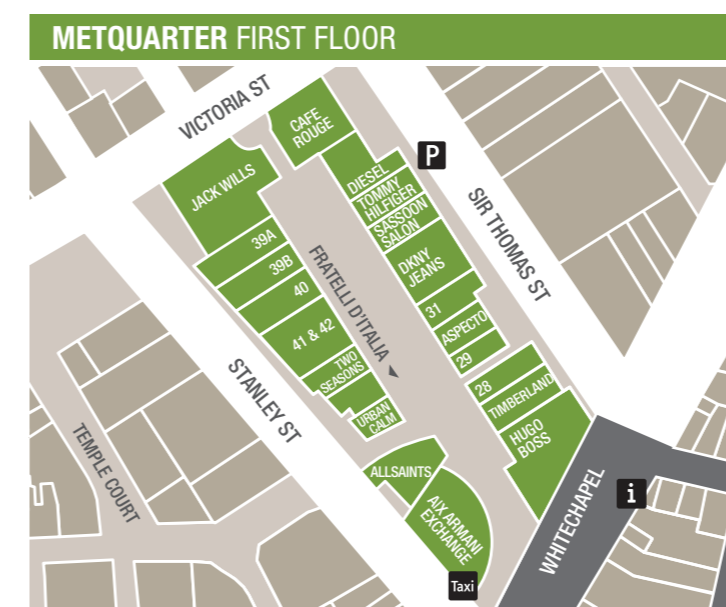
**LIVERPOOL ONE UPPER FLOOR**

An international city with a rich cultural and maritime past, Liverpool is home to world-class shopping and dining – and all within easy walking distance.



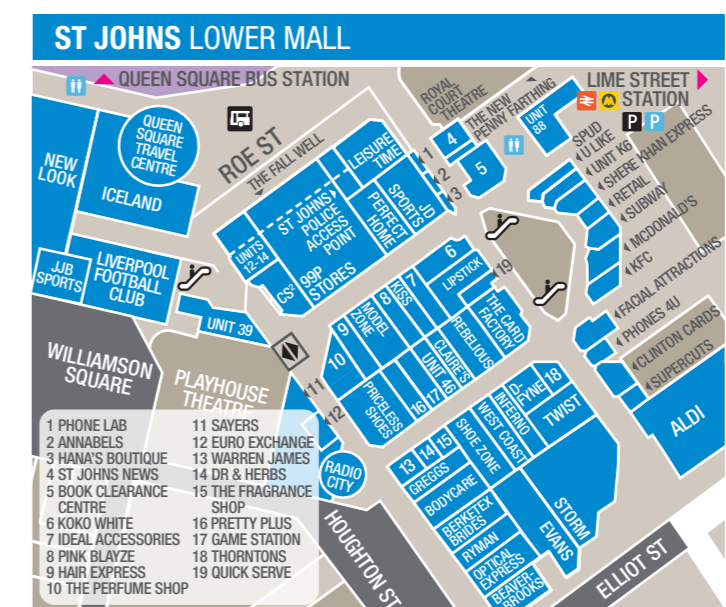
**LIVERPOOL ONE LEISURE TERRACE**

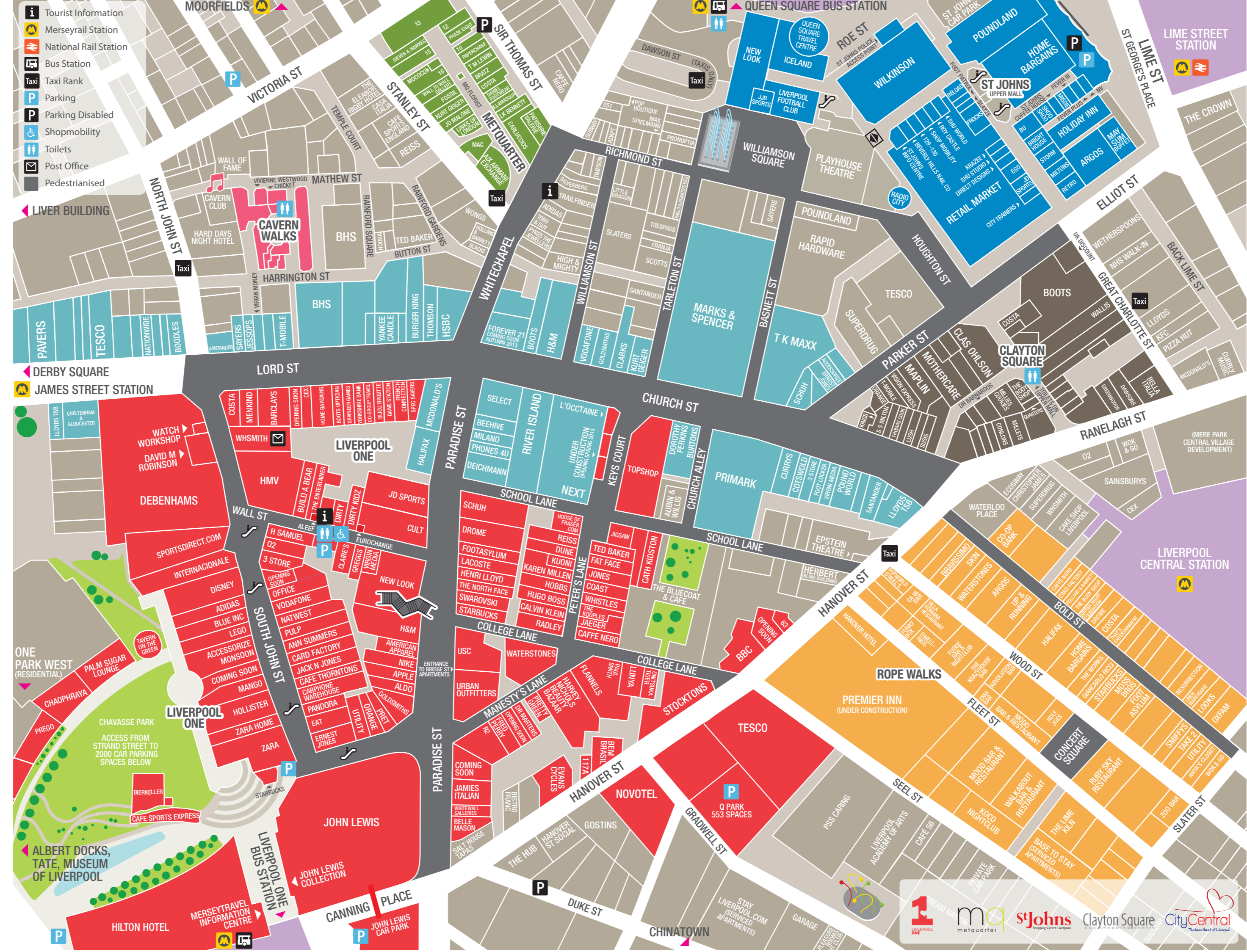
**ST JOHNS LOWER MALL**

Liverpool's rise as a visitor destination has been meteoric, it is the fourth most visited city in the UK by overseas tourists outside London and the main reason is music; a Beatles tour of Liverpool is number one on the list for those who come to Britain for the music.

Not content to be World Capital of Pop, Liverpool has an international standard of classical music with its magnificent Philharmonic Hall and its annual programme of events.

The two premier league giants Everton and Liverpool continue to attract visitors from across the globe and the John Smith's Grand National remains the biggest day in the nation's sporting calendar.

Liverpool is now in the top five of retail destinations in the UK. Church Street, Liverpool ONE, the Metquarter, St Johns, and Clayton Square as well as Cavern walks and the bohemian Bold Street offer retail therapy galore.



After you've shopped 'til you've dropped', it's time to relax. Liverpool offers visitors a wide range of quality bars and restaurants whatever the budget, and our hotels and serviced apartments will make sure your stay is a warm and welcoming one.

Liverpool's cultural offer is immense, with free outdoor events programme such as Mathew Street Music Festival, Tall Ships, Irish Festival, Africa Oye, and many other events offering a rich visitor experience.

The city often boasts that it has more museums and art galleries than anywhere in the UK outside London. The National Museums Liverpool's suite of museums and galleries as well as venues such as FACT, Open Eye Gallery, Bluecoat, St George's Hall and Sudley will enthral and entertain every age and taste..

"The future is built upon the past" is a by-line of Liverpool World Heritage City; Liverpool is a modern evolving city seeking to find the balance between conservation and regeneration.

Liverpool has a lot to offer, and to help you explore it this free city map has been produced to be your guide to the cultural and retail sectors of the city.

## World Heritage City

Liverpool was inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2004 as "The supreme example of a commercial port at the time of Britain's greatest global influence".

There are six main areas of the site which are a part of the life of the city centre;

**The Waterfront** - The focal point of Liverpool's waterfront is the stunning architecture of the Pier Head, The Cunard Building and the Port of Liverpool Building sum up the city's maritime and mercantile past and the Liverpool Cruise Terminal represents its future.

The **Albert Dock** with its many attractions such as the Maritime Museum, pays tribute to the past with exhibitions on the Transatlantic Slave Trade acknowledging Liverpool's role in the more shameful elements of its heritage. It also looks at the more immediate past in the Beatles Museum and Museum of Liverpool.

It is home to Tate Liverpool and many unique shops and restaurants as well as recognisable brands and is in close proximity to the Arena and Convention Centre and the Echo Wheel of Liverpool.

**Stanley Dock** is home to monumental warehouses and historic docks. The original Old Dock was opened in 1715 and marked the rise of the city as a port. Part of it can be seen still in an excavation below the Liverpool ONE retail development.

The historic **Commercial District** centred on **Castle Street** overlays Liverpool's seven medieval streets. Liverpool is a city built on trade and this is the area where business was historically

William Brown Street occupies today's **St George's Quarter** at the heart of the city's neo classical cultural forum. It is home to World Museum Liverpool, Liverpool Central Library, the County Sessions House and the magnificent St George's Hall. It faces the refurbished piazza of Lime Street Station an early addition to the world's first passenger railway.

**Lower Duke Street** is on the boundary of **Ropewalks** and Liverpool's **China Town**, home to the longest settled Chinese community in Europe and the second largest arch outside China. It is also home to authentic restaurants and supermarkets.

**Ropewalks** is at the heart of a thriving artistic and cultural district and home to FACT cinema and art gallery and is close to many bars and restaurants.

The **Bluecoat** the oldest building in the city centre, originally built as a charitable school and orphanage, is now a creative hub of the arts with a cafe, display centre, shops and exhibition area it has a year long programme of events to suit an eclectic range of tastes.
